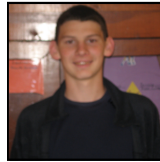
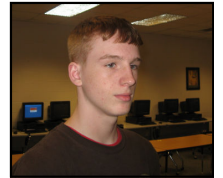
Blind Pilot Flies from London to Sydney
