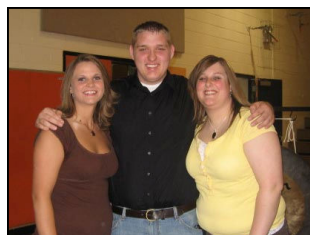

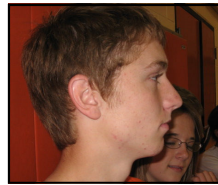
Driver Found Dead In Car
