Tornado Season

Tornado season is here! The season runs from April to July, although 61% of tornados hit between April and June, usually between 2pm and 10pm. Due to the bad fall weather, Director of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Rick McCoy, says he looks to see Ohio's tornado season for this spring to be from April to the middle of June. Here's the tornado scale, which measures the size of the tornado (category/wind/speed/damage): F0/42-72mph/Light; F1/73-112mph/Moderate; F2/113-157mph/Considerable; F3/158-206mph/Severe; F4/207-260mph/Devastating, and F5/260+mph/Incredible. Some terms you might need to know during this season are A WATCH: Conditions are favorable for a tornado to develop, and A WARNING: A tornado has been sighted or indicated by radar.
