Big Brown May Be First Triple Crown Winner Since 1978

After winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes by a total of 10 lengths, Big Brown will travel to the Belmont Stakes on June 7th. Big Brown could be the first one to win the Triple Crown in 30 years. Since Seattle Slew and Affirmed captured back-to-back Triple Crowns in 1977 and 1978, 10 horses have had their quest ended at Belmont Park in Elmont, NY, after winning the first two races. He beat a 20-horse field to win by 4-3/4 lengths at the 1-1/4 mile Kentucky Derby. Then he passed 11 other challengers for a 5-1/4 length victory at the 1-3/16-mile Preakness, the Belmont Stakes may be the biggest challenge yet. It is the longest, with a distance of 1-1/2 miles.
