WHITEOAK HALF COURT VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT

Mr. Rahe is organizing a "half-court" tournament for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders on Saturday, March 14th, and a High School and Adult Tournament on Saturday, March 21st. Matches will begin at 9 am, both days. You will be contacted to be given the time of your match.

The court will be divided down the middle, so it will be the same length as a normal High School court, but half the width. There can be only 3 players to a team. Teams can be all female, male, or co-ed. The cost is \$10 per player for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders and \$15 per player for High School and adults. All players will receive a tournament t-shirt and winning teams will also receive a "Champions" t-shirt.

This tournament is double elimination. In the winner's bracket it will be best 2 out of 3 games to 25 points and you must win by 2. In the loser's bracket it will be 1 game to 35 points and you must win by 2. The 6th grade winner will play the 7th grade winner. The winner of that match will play the 8th grade winner and that will determine the champion. The High School winner will play the adult winner to determine the champion. There will also be a concession stand available both game dates.

SSCC Patri-Tots Gets 100% Compliance

Southern State Community College's Child Care center, Patri-Tots, not only passed their licensing inspection, but soared through with a hard to attain 100 percent compliance rating. Site Administrator Kathey Chaney said the state inspector reported she was "very impressed with the way our staff works so well together with any challenges we face. She liked that we have so many child-led activities and that we use the children's opinions and feedback to help guide our projects."

Southern State houses Patri-Tots Learning Centers at Central Campus in Hillsboro and North Campus in Wilmington. Both child learning centers are licensed by the ODJFS and accept children from 18 months to 12 years of age. The facilities are open five days a week, with both part-time and full-time spaces options, providing bus pickup and drop-off services for specific local schools.
