FFA Star State Recognition

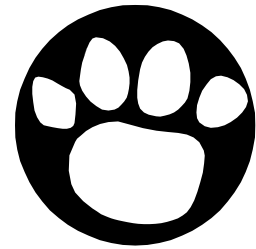

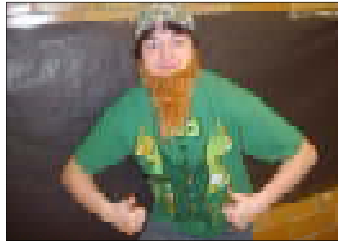
